

The Crisp County Board of Commissioners is accepting Sealed Proposals for the construction of the Airfield Drainage Rehabilitation-Phase II Project for the Cordele-Crisp County Airport located in Cordele, Ga. Proposals will be received by the owner, Crisp County Board of Commissioners/Finance Department located at 210 South 7<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 309, Cordele, Georgia 31015, **until 2:00 p.m. on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October, 2020** at which time the proposals/bids will be publicly opened, read aloud and recorded. Proposals received after the designated time will not be considered. A pre-bid meeting will be held at 2:00 p.m. on 18<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2020 at the Crisp County-Cordele Airport 1701 2<sup>nd</sup> St. N, Cordele, Georgia 31015. This project is funded under Airport Improvement Program (AIP) by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA.)

The Contractor's Proposal will include the furnishing of all labor, materials, equipment, and all things necessary pursuant to Drawings, Specifications and Conditions, etc., for Airfield Drainage Rehabilitation for Cordele-Crisp County Airport, RAC 15004.20 (the "Project").

The Project generally includes rehabilitation of the airfield drainage as shown on the plans. Contract Documents are open to the public at the Crisp County Board of Commissioners/Finance Department, 210 South 7<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 309, Cordele, Georgia 31015 and at the office of Robert and Company, Architects-Engineers-Planners. Plans can be purchased for one-hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for hard copy documents or thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) for a CD in pdf format.

No Proposal will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check or acceptable Bid Bond in an amount not less than five percent (5%) of the bid and made payable to Crisp County Commission.

All bids must be made out on the separate proposal form furnished with the Contract Documents in accordance with the instructions in the Instructions to Bidders. No interlineations, additions or deletions shall be made in the Proposal form by the bidder.

Successful Bidder shall be required to furnish a Contract Performance Bond and a Payment Bond, each equal to 100% of the Contract Price, with the terms and surety to be approved by the Owner; and furnish satisfactory proof of carriage of the insurance required.

The Owner reserves the right, with or without notice or cause to accept any bid regardless of the amount thereof; to reject any bid, any number of bids or all bids; to negotiate with any bidder for a reduction or alteration in its bid; to waive or insist upon formal requirements; to reject all bids and to call for additional bids upon the same or different invitation to bid, Plans and Specifications; to be the sole judge, in its discretion, of all questions as to whether or not a bid complies with the Invitation to Bid, the Plans or the Specifications, and as to the qualifications of a bidder to perform the Contract.

Bidders shall inform themselves concerning Georgia laws and comply with same. Bidders shall inform themselves of and comply with the following regulations:

- Buy American Preferences (Title 49, United States Code, Chapter 501)
- Foreign Trade Restriction (DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 30)
- Davis Bacon Act (DOL Regulation 29 CFR Part 5)
- Affirmative Action to Ensure Equal Employment Opportunity (Executive Order 11246 and DOL Regulations 41 CFR Part 60)
- Government Wide Debarment and Suspension and Government Requirements for Drug-Free Workplace (DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 29)

No bidder may withdraw his bid within 90 days after the actual date of the opening thereof.

The successful bidder shall commence work with adequate force and equipment on a date to be specified in a written order of the Engineer and shall complete the work within 75 consecutive calendar days.
