

National Change of Address (NCOA)

· O.C.G.A. 21-2-233

(a) The Secretary of State is authorized to cause at his or her discretion the official list of electors to be compared to the change of address information supplied by the United States Postal Service through its licensees periodically for the purpose of identifying those electors whose addresses have changed.

National Change of Address (NCOA)

- · Voter notifies USPS of a new address.
- · Three categories with three different notices:
 - · Out of State
 - Notice is mailed to the voter prompting them to cancel their registration if they have moved out of state.
 - Voter will be moved to inactive if they do not respond within 30 days.
 - · Out of County AND Within State
 - · Notice is mailed to the voter prompting them to update their record.
 - Voter will be moved to inactive if they do not respond within 30 days.
 - · Within County
 - Notice is mailed to the voter informing them that they will be moved to the new address if they do not respond within 30 days.
